- NYS English as a Second Language Achievement Test scores on four sub-components--annual
- Immigrant status (within three years of entering the U.S.)
- Migrant
- Homeless (family – various options for nighttime residence)
- Homeless unaccompanied youth status (Yes/No)
- Neglected or delinquent student
- Universal Pre-K program participation
- Pre-school disability
- Title I services (for low-income students)

- Participation in Career & Technical (CTE) coursework or a program and level of participation
- Type of credential/diploma earned (Regents, Advanced, With Honors, Advanced With Honors, with CTE endorsement)
- Reasons for dropping out
- Transferred to a GED program & whether GED was earned
- Post-graduate plans (college, military, seek employment, other)
